

NOTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 2024 SESSION MEETING...

At its October 13th meeting, Session attended to the following items:

- *Heard Elder Debra Everhart offer a devotional from Ecclesiastes 3:11, regarding God's timing for everything and our inability to trust and surrender to it. Elder Everhart then offered a prayer.
- *Approved Minutes from the Stated Meeting on September 9, 2024, and the Called Meeting held on October 13, 2024. Amended Minutes from the Called Meeting held on September 23, 2024, were also approved. Approved minutes are on the hallway bulletin board or available by request from the clerk.

Received a letter from PC(USA) Office of Ministry Engagement and Support thanking us for our submission of \$128.33 in Mission Support and \$9.25 for Cents-Ability. Received prayers from First Presbyterian, South Charleston; Second Presbyterian, Huntington; Glenville Presbyterian, Point Pleasant Presbyterian and Belington Presbyterian churches.

- *Received a report from Transition Team Co-Chairperson Sherri Marstiller on good information rendered from our town hall meetings. The team is having conversations with community leaders in education, business, government and others. Retreat plans are evolving, with an event planned on Sunday afternoon, November 17, presenting our Mission Study Report that will then be reviewed by the PWV Committee on Ministry, and passed on to our PNC.
- *Treasurer Sherri Marstiller thanked Debra Everhart for witnessing the weekly report process this month. Linda Rudy volunteered to cover the 20th for her and will also do it in November. Elder Everhart volunteered for December.
- *Rev. Moore reported training sessions for incoming Ruling Elders Sara Gerot, Robert Hermanson, David Hyer and Youth Elder Samantha White are underway and will tentatively end on November 17.
- *Finance Approved a 3% raise in Bob Stottlemyer's hourly raise as a one-year employment anniversary increase.

Accepted financial reports that are available from the treasurer upon request.

*Property – The basement level floor preparation has begun for the vinyl plank flooring; a replacement sink is on order and the replacement countertops are here. A thorough final cleaning is planned.

A Siemens estimate to replace failed temperature sensors upstairs will be considered by the committee, then referred to session for approval at a called meeting. Miley Legal Group has a hearing scheduled for February 13-14, 2025, in our action against Church Mutual, URETEK and the City of Elkins.

*Worship – To date, worship expenses are \$16,182.71, within budget. Communion servers in October were Tessa Garver-Daniels, Debra Everhart, David Hyer and Cliff Marstiller. Thank you! The committee also thanks Pastor Moore, Phil Becker and Lynn Proudfoot for serving as liturgists!

*Witness and Service – We will host Common Ground on November 9: volunteers need to report at 10:30. Another organization served on our date of September 28.

Chairman Becker shared some of our food stores and clothing – including coats to the North Carolina flood relief collection at the Baptist Church.

*Christian Education – The Autumn session of Bread & Broth has begun.

- *Membership Committee is identifying homebound members to receive directories.
- *Fellowship In between events; looking forward to the next thing.
- * Nominating/Leadership/Personnel Recruiting Pastor Nominating Committee members.
- *The next meeting of the West Virginia Presbytery is Thursday, November 21; we need to elect a Ruling Elder Commissioner.
- *Considered changing when regular meetings are held during the winter months. The next meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 10, at 3:00.
